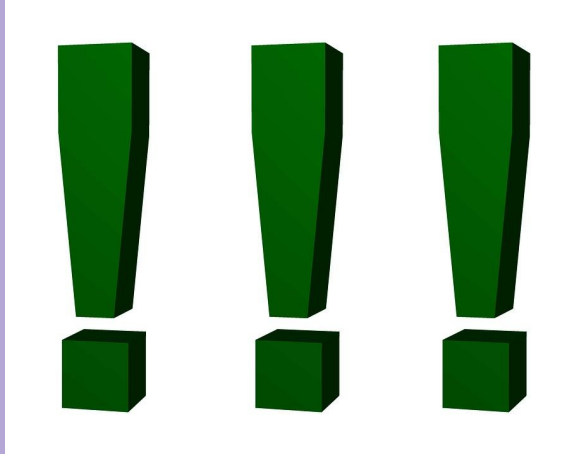

Periods

Used in:

- Declarative Sentences
- Statement Sentences
(When declaring or stating something)
- Commanding Sentences
- Imperative Sentences
(When commanding or instructing someone)

Bring my bag from the kitchen.

My bag is in Locker #34.

Read your book.

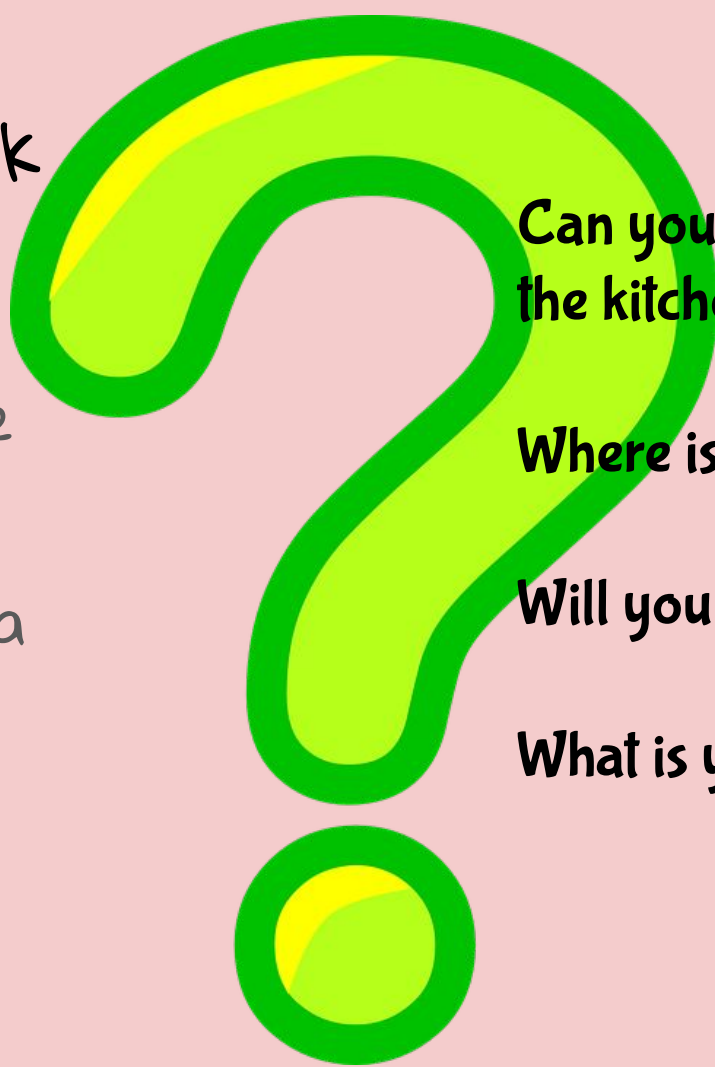
My favourite colour is purple.

Question Mark

Used in:

- Interrogative Sentence

(When asking a question)



Can you bring me my bag from the kitchen?

Where is your bag?

Will you read your book?

What is your favourite colour?

Exclamation Mark

Used in:

- Exclamation / Exclamatory Sentence.

(In something exciting)

- Lists
